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ABSTRACT

The present study is seeking to deterenthe proportion of the Islamic lifest components and perfectionism components in predicting marital adjustry high school teachers in Birjand. This is a correlation research in which a of Birjand high school teachers (including 150 men 4500 women) was select based on random cluster sampling. Lowkellace marital adjustment to (LWMAT), Kaviani short form Islamic lifestyle test (ILST), Tehr multidimensional perfectionism scale (TMPS) are the questionnaires usec study. Then thenethods of descriptive statistics such as mean, standard de and inferential statistical indices of multivariate regression are used. Result that there is a positive significant relationship between Islamic lifestyle marital adjustment buthere is a negative significant relationship betv communityoriented perfectionism and marital adjustment; and the aspe Islamic lifestyle and those of perfectionism have the ability to predict m adjustment up to 10%, and among the aspects Islamic lifestyle, health chronological (time) and moral factors are able to predict marital adjustment we can claim that an optimum marital adjustment can be created for an inc based on Islamic lifestyle.

> The little research has been done on the relationship relationship between perfectionism and feeling lonely and quality of life of medical students in Gillan, found that

there is a significant negative relationship between perfectionism and quality offe. Mohammadi and Jawkar (2010) in a research as •perfectionism, emotional problems and life satisfaction in Iranian students, found that there is a significant negative relationship between and emotional problems and perfectionism satisfaction.

Ashby et al (2008) studied the relationship between perfectionism (normal and abnormal) and the quality and satisfaction of the marital relations in 197 couples. Results indicate that couples with abnormal perfectionism had reported less satisfaction and bituya of the marital relations. While, those with normal perfectionism, had higher quality relations and enjoyed more satisfaction in marital relation. In couples that at least one of them had normal perfectionism, the likelihood of having an efficient and satisfactory relation increased.

Felt et al (2001) in their study examined perfectionism, beliefs and marital adjustment. The findings showed that ou This test has shown high validity by creating a clear self-oriented perfectionism and oth**er**iented perfectionism are associated with lower levels of marital satsfaction and sexual satisfaction in men and women. Also Haring, Hewitt and Felt (2004) found that there is a negative relationship between perfectionism and quality and satisfaction in marital relations.

In spite of pleasantness of the marriage phenomeno researches suggest that the couples€ satisfaction and marital adjustment is not easily achieved. As a result, the ŏü Tehran strongest divine link, that is, marriage it its strongest base, that is, family is subjected to serious danger. Moreover, according to thehigh rates of importance that today€s communities consider for strengthening and maintaining the family, health and webeing of the society individuals, studying the problems and issues that result in family disintegration and marital relations seems neœssary. In addition, according to the high rate of divorce and marital discord, conducting a research in this field is necessary.

Accordingly, the researcher sought to determine the contribution of lifestyle factors considered in Islamic lifestyle (social worship, beliefs, ethics, finance, family, perfectionism oriented (SOP), othæmiented (OOP), and perfectionism socially perfectionism (SPP) in predicting marital adjustment. METHODS

including 135 questions and 76 respectively. In this study, the short form wassedu Its validity in relation to religious orientation has been reported 0.64. (Kaviani, 2012). This test measures 10 aspects including social, worship, beliefs, moral, financial, family, health, knowledge and thought, security and timing components. En th present study, reliability was obtained as 0.87 by Cronbach€s alpha method.

- ðü Locke-Wallace marital adjustment test (LWMAT): it is a short selfeport questionnaire designed to measure the quality of marriage reaction and is the most common tool of measument used in the field (Harrison and Westhuis, 1989). The test contains 15 items, and the range of scores on this test can be 2 158. Low scores show incompatibility and high scores show adjustment, and scores below 100 indicate stress in marital relation(Sanaei Zaker, 2008).
- distinction between spouses who have been adjustment well and those who have suffered from stress (Locke and Wallace, 1959). Thiesst was translated by Mazaheri and was appliedaosample of Iranian couples; he reported the reliability and validity of this test by splithalf method as higher than 90 (Mazaheri, 2000). In the present study, reliability of this scale was obtained 0.70 by Cronbach€s.
- multidimensional perfectiism scale (TMPS): This is a 30tem questionnaire that has been made in Persian based on previous scales (Hewitt and Felt, 2002; Frostt al, 1990; Hewittet al, 1991) that 10 items measurself-oriented perfectionism (SOP).10 items measureother orientedperfectionism (OOP), and the latt items measuresocially prescribed perfectionism (SRR)a 5-option Likert scale (from grades 1 to 5). Scoring method for all data is as reverse scoring, that is, the option •completely agree, is grade 5, and the optio •completely disagree, is grade 1 (Besharat, 2007).
